ST PATRICK PATRON OF IRELAND

March 17th is St. Patrick's Day, the annual feast day celebrating the patron saint of Ireland. He was born around the year 385, in a village in Wales. When he was 16, a group of Irish pirates raided his village taking many of the young men back to Ireland to work as slaves. Patrick worked for six years as a



herdsman in the Irish countryside. In his sixth year, he escaped & made his way back to Wales. But, according to his autobiography, soon after he got back home he heard a voice telling him to go back to Ireland & convert the Irish to Christianity. That's eventually what he did, but firstly he went to France to visit monasteries & study religious texts. After 12 years in France, he went back to Ireland, where he founded monasteries, schools, & churches converting much of the island to Christianity. We pray for all those members of our parishes whose family are from the 'Emerald Isle.'





Saints of the Week.....

ST JOSEPH

Tuesday 19th March is the feast of St Joseph. Nothing is known of St Joseph except what is said of him in the Gospels. He was a carpenter; he accepted the will of God; he supported Mary & brought up Jesus. From the human character of his son, it is seeen that he was a good & responsible father. He is widely venerated as a patron of artisans, who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, & of workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration

ST CUTHBERT DIOCESAN PATRON MARCH 20TH

Cuthbert spent his early life in north Northumberland. As a teenager he joined the monastery at Melrose under St Eata. After the Council of Whitby, he was made Prior of Lindisfarne,

where he persuaded the community to change from Celtic to Roman customs & practices. During his years as a priest, Cuthbert was an indefatiguable worker, travelling long & arduous journeys to minister to people in the remotest parts of the diocese. His love of solitude took him to St Cuthbert's Isle, just off Lindisfarne, but he later sought permission to live as a hermit on the remote island of Inner Farne. In 684 Cuthbert was asked to become Bishop of Hexham, but he immediately exchanged his see with St Eata of Lindisfarne. Once again he devoted himself wholeheartedly to the care of his people. His time as a bishop was short and, sensing that his life was drawing to a close, he returned to his beloved Inner Farne, where he died in 687. Eleven years later, during the transfer of his remains to a new shine, his body was found to be incorrupt & it immediately became an object of special veneration.

When the Vikings destroyed Lindisfarne in 875, Cuthbert's body was removed for safe keeping. It travelled all over the north—just as it had during his life—reaching Durham, its final resting place in 955, where a Saxon church was built to house the relics. Many miracles were attributed to Cuthbert's intercession & during the Middle Ages, his shrine became one of the most popular places of pilgrimage. The present Romanesque cathedral at Durham is a fine tribute to this great Northern saint.

We keep in our prayers especially on this day all the parishioners of St Cuthbert's Kenton & the Staff & Pupils of St Cuthbert's Primary School Kenton & St Cuthbert's High School.


JUSTICE AND PEACE COFFEE ON SUNDAYS
