Based on the gospel for Sunday 29th September : 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

"Anyone who is not against us is for us."

The disciples are indignant – someone "who is not one of us" has been casting out evil spirits in the name of Jesus. Surely he must be stopped! Jesus is quick to contradict them and in doing so shows us that we must be open to seeing God at work through those different to us, rejecting any form of "us" and "them" that brings only division and fragmentation.

There are many challenges our global family faces: inequality, racism, poverty and the climate crisis. It can be hard to know where to start. Today's gospel reminds us that we are not asked singlehanded to solve everything, but simply to respond to the needs we see before us. SAFEGUARDING AGENCY REPORTS 'SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS' IN STANDARDS –

The agency which oversees safeguarding in the Catholic Church has reported "significant progress" in standards in the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle. An interim review of safeguarding in leadership, governance, ministry and culture, which was published on Tuesday by the Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency, praised progress achieved since the last review of the Diocese. The summary of the report complimented the strong leadership and public commitment to effective safeguarding of Bishop Stephen Wright, saying the diocesan bishop has "empowered others to make their own positive contributions to promoting a safer environment within the Diocese"

Saints of the Weeek

ST LAURENCE RUIZ

Laurence was born into a Christian family at Manila in the Philippines around the year 1600. As a married layman, he was very active in his local Dominican church. It appears that he was accused (for unknown reasons) of murder, & sought asylum on board ship with some Dominican priests. who were heading for Japan to carry out missionary work at a time of intense religious persecution. Soon after arriving, the group were exposed as Christians, taken to Nagasaki, & tortured for several days. All of them chose to die rather that renounce their faith. Laurence was canonized in 1987, the first Filipino martyr to be proclaimed a saint.

ST MARIA FAUSTINA KAWALSKA

The following extract is taken from the Decree of the Congregation for Divine Worship, issued 18th May 2020. "Born in Glowiec, Poland in 1905 & dying in Krakow in 1938, St Maria Faustina spent her short life among the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, developing an intense spiritual life. In her diary, she recounts what the Lord worked in her for the benefit of all. Listening to him who is love & mercy, she understood that no human wretchedness could measure itself against the mercy which ceaselessly pours from the heart of Christ. Thus she became the inspiration for a movement dedicated to proclaiming & imploring Divine Mercy. Canonised by Pope John Paul II in the year 2000, the name of Faustina quickly became known throughout the world, thereby proclaiming the invocation of Divine Mercy amongst the People of God & its credible witness in the conduct of the lives of believers."


In 20001, the 2nd Sunday of Easter was proclaimed as Divine Mercy Sunday, a Feast to be celebrated by the whole Church.
