Based on the gospel for Sunday 13th October, Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Mark 10:17-30

"It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for someone rich to enter the kingdom of God."

My partner and I were talking to a friend the other day about money. I made the point that money has the value that you put on it, in the sense that it can be used wisely or unwisely. Was this just a reflection of the fact that I have a nice job, a comfortable flat, all the food I require and access to free healthcare?

Jesus is uncompromising: being rich - and in this country many of us are in that category, relatively speaking - is a bar to entering the kingdom of God.

I mentioned shelter, nutrition and healthcare - these are among the things that Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh lack. Conversely, in his encyclical Laudato Si', Pope Francis makes the point that approximately a third of all food produced is discarded, which effectively means

stealing it from the table of people who are experiencing poverty.

Maybe, to return to the question of value, we should reframe what we own and earn - and, equally, our gifts and time - in terms of their value to others.

Saints of the Weeek

SAINTS CHAD & CEDD

St Chad was a disciple of St Aidan, educated partly on Lindisfarne & partly in Ireland. He succeeded his brother Cedd, as abbot of Lastingham in North Yorkshire, but when St Wilfrid, the newly appointed Archbishop of York remained in France



for a lengthy period after his nomination, Chad was consecrated to replace him. Doubts over the regularity of this appointment led to his deposition by Theodore, Archbishop of Canterbury, but his humility & exemplary lifestyle brought about a change of heart in Theodore & Chad was given the See of Lichfield, as Bishop of the Mercians. A number of early churches were dedicated to him, especially in the Midlands & his relics are preserved in Birmingham Metropolitan Cathedral, & dedicated to him. He died in AD.672

St Cedd, brother of Chad, was also a Lindisfarne monk, but a great deal of his ministry was spent in evangelising the Midlands, where he served as Bishop of the East Saxons. He died in retirement in the year 664 at Lastingham, the Yorkshire monastic community he had founded some years earlier. Their feast day is celebrated on October 26th.
